TRAVELLING TO ATLANTIS HISTORIC INN & BARBADOS

LOCATION

Atlantis Historic Inn sits along the rugged east coast of the island in Tent Bay, St. Joseph at Bathsheba This boutique hotel one of the first on the island in its day, has unparalleled views of the untouched beauty of the Atlantic coastline. The capital Bridgetown is 35 minutes' drive away.

ACCESS

There are scheduled flights from London Gatwick and London Heathrow to Barbados and from the USA and other international gateways. Barbados is serviced by inter-island carriers offering easy access from other Caribbean islands such as Grenada, Antigua and St Lucia.

Direct scheduled services to Barbados from London with British Airways and Virgin Atlantic, plus Virgin Atlantic and Aer Lingus from Manchester during the winter months.

CLIMATE

Average temperatures range from 84 degrees F to 85 degrees F (27 degrees C) the lowest temperatures occur between November and February. The climate is warm all year round, the dry season is between January and May and the rainy season is from June to December.

UNITED KINGDOM

Flights from the United Kingdom to Grantley Adams International Airport, Barbados.

British Airways / Virgin Atlantic Airways / TUI Airways

Flying time - Approximately 8 hours outbound during the day and inbound to UK overnight.

EUROPE - Germany

Germany - Condor - from Germany to Grantley Adams International Airport, Barbados. Flying time - Approximately 10 hours outbound during the day and inbound overnight.

USA

American Airlines / JetBlue / Delta Airlines / United Airlines Direct services from Miami approximately 3.5- hours. New York approximately 4.5-hours. There are flights from other US gateways with connections to Barbados.

CANADA

Air Canada / West Jet

Flying time - Approximately 5.5 hours direct from Toronto and will differ from other Canadian cities.

Inter Caribbean / SVG / Caribbean Airlines / Virgin Atlantic (St Vincent & Grenada only). There are a number of independent inter island airlines that offer connection to and from Barbados to other Caribbean islands.

Visitors must have a valid passport and return or onward ticket. Passports must be valid for at least six (6) months from arrival into the country. However, if you are a British, Canadian or US citizen, proof of citizenship bearing a photograph is acceptable.

You will be met on arrival just off the tarmac at BGI and escorted swiftly through immigration and customs using a special Fast Track lane. This allows you to depart the airport within 40 minutes of landing. On your return, you are met on arrival at the airport, escorted to check in, then whisked through a private security lane and either straight to the VIP lounge or to the boarding gate.

All charges for additional services such as the licence fees which total approximately US\$200 plus extras for photography, flowers etc. and these charges will be payable locally.

The marriage certificate and photos will be delivered or posted to the couple

Legal Requirements:

There is no official waiting period prior to the wedding ceremony. Couples must first go to the Ministry of Legal Affairs to obtain their Marriage Licence and the marriage can then take place (the Ministry is closed on Saturday, Sunday and Public Holidays). A letter will be obtained by the local agent, from the Marriage Officer stating that they will perform the wedding service.

The following documents are required:

Valid passports.

If divorced, the original Decree Absolute papers must be produced.

If widowed, the marriage certificate and partner's Death Certificate must be produced, unless the death certificate carries the name of the surviving partner.

If under 18 years of age, he/she must be accompanied by a parent.

If above documents are not in English, an official translation of these in English, must accompany the originals.

Church Weddings

Weddings in church can be arranged at an additional charge. However, if guests request a Catholic wedding, two- or three-months' notice will be required as it is necessary for documentation to be prepared by the local church.

Festivals & Culture

Barbados has a year-round calendar of events and festivals sporting fixtures with horse racing, polo, cricket, Food and Rum Festival and Dive Fest. Crop Over in August is one long party with an explosion of music, street parade, colourful costumes and intoxicating rhythms, and revelling party in true Bajan style.

Hunte's Gardens

Created by a legendary horticulturist with an unusual flair, Anthony Hunte, these extraordinary gardens will flabbergast even the most keen gardeners and enthusiasts.

St. Nicholas Abbey

Built in the mid-1650s, is one of the few Jacobean-style houses left in the Western Hemisphere and one of the oldest buildings on the island. This elegant home was also a working sugar plantation during the days of slavery and many of its working buildings remain.

Soup Bowl, Bathsheba

A surfer's paradise – This beach has consistent and sizeable waves and is best known for its unique shaped rocks and terrain, with surf school for all levels of experience.

Mount Gay Rum Refinery & Rum Tours

Barbados is the birthplace of rum and Mount Gay is the oldest rum refinery in the world, so be sure not to leave the island without sampling some of this famous delicious rum! Tours of our local distilleries are favourites among visitors and locals alike.

Kensington Oval, Bridgetown

Once the grounds of a plantation house, this stadium is well known for its historic cricket matches and entertaining atmosphere.

Harrison's Cave

Said to be one of the world's wonders and one of the 'Seven Wonders of Barbados', Harrison's Cave is an exciting journey into the subterranean landscape of our island
